INCOME GENERATING PASTORS TRAINING ACTIVITIES

There has been much progress in terms of improvement of self-esteem amongst the beneficiaries. Beatrice, a disabled lady, (see above) who we have spoken about before - with her tailoring project, has had a further loan and has now bought a milling machine. People are coming in big numbers to grind their grain. She is already paying back the loan and many are benefitting....

The training programme for church leaders is continuing... Seminars are taking place in Cankuzo, Muzye, Bukeye and Nyanza Lac (Muyange). Courses include - Biblical Counselling. Expository preaching, biblical theology and biblical interpretation. The books are translated into Kirundi and help them to prepare seminars in their respective churches.

NYEMBUYE CLINIC (Rutana)

Good quality medical services are now being offered to Nyembuye and surrounding villages helped by a regular supply of funds for medication from UK donors.

Outcomes: One pastor said that he planted banana trees and has changed the way he harvests to increase productivity. He is teaching his parishioners to increase food production so people have enough to eat and surplus for the market.

Another leader said that she was able to start a Christian group to help the sick, orphans and widows. She organised a seminar and urged women she represents to manage time, initiate income generation, and improve farming techniques and trading.



The next project is to raise funds for another building with 2 rooms for a dentistry (Dentists are visiting from Scotland again this summer) and 2 rooms for temporary admission of vulnerable people unable to go back home ...

Fruit is being grown for training on improved nutrition and supply for those in need.

At the time of writing Burundi is preparing for the referendum on the constitution on 17th May.

NEW DATA PROTECTION THEO'S BOOK LEGISLATION

comes into force on the 25th May 2018 covering the protection and security of personal data of all EU citizens held by organisations worldwide. The UK Government is committed to retaining this in law following Brexit (if there is one).

We are required to have a number of documented policies, and to advise data subjects (*i.e. people whose personal data we hold*) how we hold, use, retain and destroy their data, and what their rights are in connection with such data. This is explained on our website in our Privacy Notice. Please read it.

A general principle which is new is that of 'hard consent' or 'opt-in', whereby organisations can only communicate with data subjects under specific conditions, whereby (amongst others) they can only send out marketing materials if a data subject has expressly given consent (*i.e. a tickbox to indicate 'yes' rather than 'no'*). The legislation does allow existing relationships to continue under the 'legitimate interest' condition, although many organisations are asking all their contacts to opt-in before the 25th anyway.

You are receiving this newsletter because you are on our mailing list. Because we cannot be sure whether you or one of our overseas partners gave us your contact details, **we need to ask you for your consent to continue to receive our communications.**


